

This is the last Will and Testament of me John Yeo of Okehampton, Devon, baker. I give and Bequeath unto my wife [Elizabeth] all my Household Goods and Furniture Money and Wearing Apparel for her own use. I give and bequeath unto my said wife All my Freehold and Leasehold Houses Fields and Gardens for and during her natural life or Widowhood and immediately after her death or second marriage I give and Bequeath All my said Freehold and Leasehold Property unto and for the Use and Behoof of my Son and Daughter now living and to their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns for ever as Tenants in common And I charge my said Freehold and Leasehold property with the payment of my Debts and Funeral and Testamentary Expenses And [I] appoint my said Wife Executrix In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand this third day of September one thousand eight hundred and Forty-nine.

Signed by the said Testator with his mark the same having been first read over to him in the presence of us who being present at the same time and in the presence of the Testator have subscribed our Names as Witnesses C. Seymour, A. N. McLine.

Probate was granted at Totnes on 12 April 1850 to Elizabeth Yeo, the executor named in the will.
